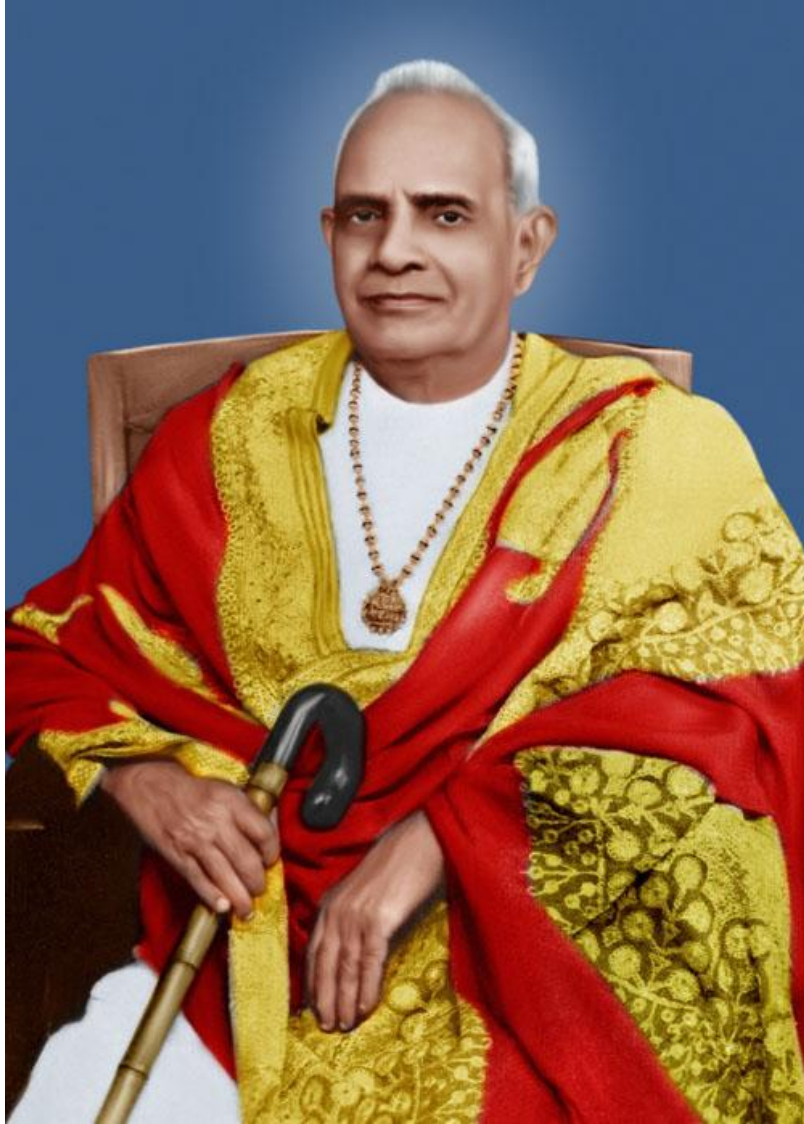

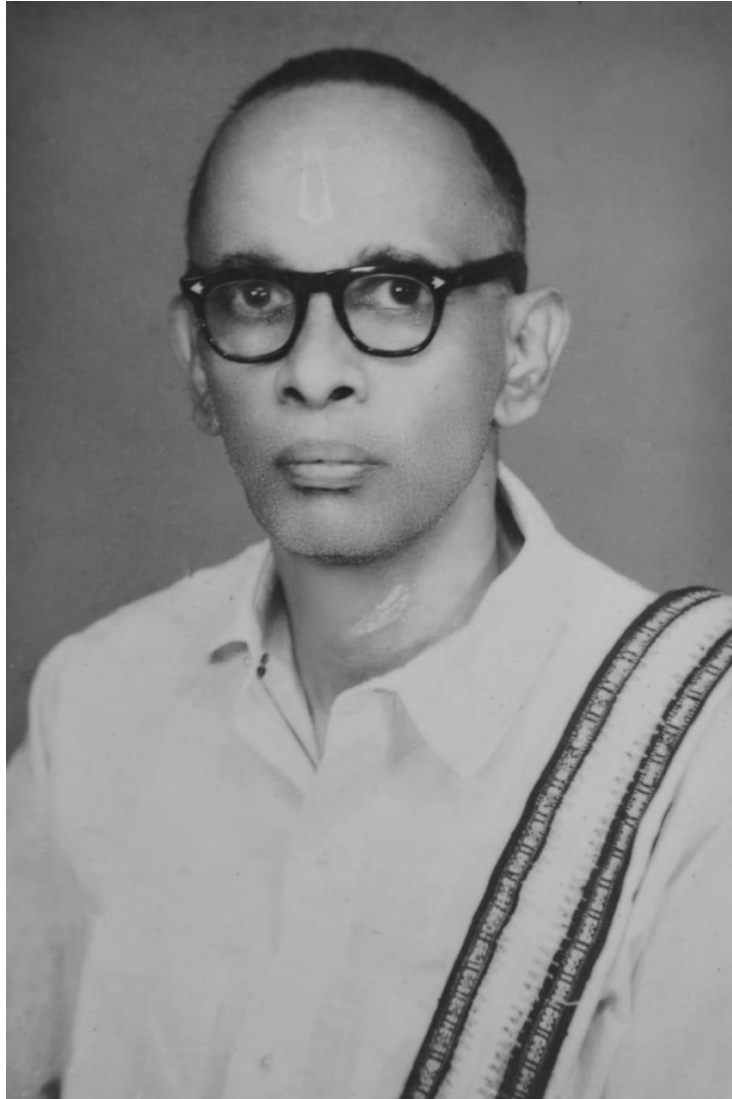

ABOUT THE FOUNDER

Shri. Mannathu Padmanabhan, the peerless leader of Nair Community, the immortal founder of the Nair Service Society and the great social reformer was born in the closing decades of the 19th century in Perunnai, a village in Changanacherry taluk of the erstwhile state of Travancore as the son of middle-class parents. Abject poverty, misery and deprivation marked the early years of his life. After school education he became a teacher and then a pleader. Before long he found himself drawn into the vortex of political and social movements. The plight of the Nair Community that was witnessing its own decadence and disintegration, precipitated by extravaganza, superstitious veneration for antiquated and anachronistic customs and tradition, filled him with anguish. He marshaled his skill and organizational ability to motivate, inspire and mobilize the community that was lost in a long and deep slumber. The Nair Service Society which he conceived, nursed and nurtured epitomized the hopes and aspirations of the community which had been waiting for a saviour.

Mannam's personal life was inextricably intertwined with the history of the N.S.S. He travelled extensively through the state, met the people, organized them and won their love and regard with the help of his disarming simplicity, single-minded devotion, will and determination. Impregnable fortress of superstition and formidable citadel of resistance crumbled before his all-conquering and awe-inspiring personality. Gradually he built an empire out of nothing. The prestigious institutions founded by him would perpetuate his memory. Captivated by Mahatma Gandhi and his principles of Satyagraha, Mannam led a Satyagraha march called "Savarnajatha" for the sake of the untouchables. It ultimately led to the "Temple Entry Proclamation". The dynamic roles he played in the "Vaikom Satyagraham" and in the independence struggle and his subsequent imprisonment and his initiatives aimed at communal harmony, peace and social changes turned him into a legend in his life time. The major milestones in the history of the N.S.S intersect the social, political and cultural history of Kerala. Mannam passed away at the ripe age of 93. The story of his life is the stuff, fairy tales are made of. The touch of his magic wand revived and resurrected the entire community. He taught them the philosophy of action, the value of unity and above all the need to change. His legacy is undiminished by passage of time. He lives through generations.

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GLIMPSE OF THE COLLEGE

NSS College Manjeri is a Govt. Aided Arts & Science College of Nair Service Society. The College is affiliated to University of Calicut and is one of the oldest institutions for higher education in Malappuram District. The idea to start a College at Manjeri was conceived by Shri. Pulikkat Achuthan Nair. The meeting to discuss the possibility of a College under Nair Service Society was attended by Shri. Mannath Padmanabhan and a committee was constituted for this. The college was inaugurated by Shri. P.M. Thirumulpad on 15th July 1965. It is situated on a hill of scenic beauty comprising vast area donated by Shri. P. M. Thirumulpad that provides an ideal atmosphere for the pursuit of higher education. The College was upgraded to first grade on 12th August 1970. The college is owned and managed by the Nair Service Society which considers education as a social service. It is sincerely engaged in providing free and fair education to all without any consideration of class, creed and community with due consideration to the economically backward sections of the society. Like the other 23 Colleges owned and nursed by Nair Service Society, this College also owes its origin to its legendary founder Padma Bhushan Mannathu Padmanabhan. Shri. G. Sukumaran Nair, General Secretary, Nair Service Society is constantly looking upon the growth and development of the college. Prof. (Dr.) Sujatha.S, Secretary, NSS College's Central Committee & Corporate Manager is eagerly monitoring the day-to-day activities of the college on its path to accomplish the mission.

The college was formally inaugurated by Sri. P.M. Thirumulpad on 15th July 1965. The jubilee of the institution was celebrated with splendor in 1990 and a new two storied block was declared opened by Sri. P.K. Narayana Panicker, the then General Secretary, Nair Service Society. A new stadium was constructed with the help of UGC in the vicinity of the Institution. A Computer lab, a fully equipped seminar hall are recent additions to the facilities available to students.

The computer lab conducts a training Programme with the aim of acquiring 100% computer literacy among the staff and students of the college.

At present this college offers eight Under Graduate courses and three Post Graduate courses. A strong faculty comprising 54 teachers, sixty percent of whom are Research Degree holders manages the teaching and learning process.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT AND SEMESTER SYSTEM

Calicut University regulations are framed in accordance with UGC guidelines on restructuring undergraduate education from 2009-10 academic year itself. Accordingly, all affiliated colleges have restructured the regular undergraduate programmes on the Choice Based Credit Semester System (CBCSS), a combination of internal and external evaluation with grading.

UG PROGRAMME STRUCTURE (3 year)

Semester &Duration

Semester means a term consisting of 18 weeks (16 instructional weeks and two weeks for examination). The duration of a UG Programme shall be 6 semesters distributed over a period of 3 academic years.

Courses

The UG Programme shall include five types of courses, viz; Common Courses, Core courses, Complementary courses, Open Course and Audit courses.



Credit & Grade

Credit of a course measure is measure of weekly unit of work involving lecture or laboratory sessions or seminar or similar activity designed for the course. Each credit hour is roughly equivalent to one hour of class per week in a semester. 'Grade' indicates the level of performance of a student in a course

Grade Point

It is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the broad level of performance of a student in a course. The product of Grade Point and the Credit of a course is called 'Credit Point'. Grade Point means point given to a letter grade on 10-point scale.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)

It is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points obtained by a student in the various courses taken in a semester by the total number of credits in that semester. SGPA shall be rounded off to three decimal places.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

It is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points in all the semesters taken by the student for the entire Programme by the total number of credits in the entire Programme.

Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP)

With the direction of Govt of Kerala and Kerala State Higher Education Department, University of Calicut along with all other Universities in Kerala are implementing the Four Year Under Graduate Programme with effect from 2024 admission onwards. The Calicut University FYUGP Regulations is implemented vide U.O.No. 10062/2024/Admn dated 26/06/2024. CUFYUGP will have 3 types of programmes namely (a) 3 Year UG Programme, (b) 4 Year UG Honours Programme and (3) 4 Year UG Honours with Research. Students in Calicut University can choose any of the 5 different pathways namely (a) Single Major Pathway, (b) Major with Multiple Disciplines, (3) Major with Minor Pathway, (4) Vocational Minor Pathway and (5) Double Major Pathway. The various courses are classified as Major courses, Minor Courses, General Foundation Courses which includes Ability Enhancement Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses, Value Added Courses and Multi-Disciplinary Courses. Students will have to do internship before the commencement of sixth semester. The NSS College Manjeri, as per the direction of University of Calicut, forms an FYUGP Committee consisting of 10 members for the effective implementation of four year programme. The NSS College Manjeri offers 8 UG Honours Programmes (8 UG Departments), 1 Honours with Research Programme (B.A History), 3 PG Programmes and I PhD Programme (PhD in History). For the convenience of

students, FYUGP Committee groups the various minor courses in the first semester into 2 categories. The category I includes 11 minor courses and category II includes 9 minor courses. The College also offers 9 multi-disciplinary courses in the first semester.

Applications in the prescribed form are invited by the University twice a year, in June and December.

Eligibility- Students

Only candidates who have qualified in the Entrance Test conducted by the University of Calicut or National Eligibility Test conducted by UGC/CSIR or GATE or State Level Eligibility Test conducted by the Kerala Government or who possesses M.Phil. Degree by research in addition to Masters Degree or its equivalent with not less than 55% marks will be considered eligible to apply for registration for Ph.D. (SC/ST 45% marks in Science, 40% marks Arts and Commerce).

Eligibility- Teachers

5% marks relaxation for the candidates with minimum 10 years of teaching experience. Teachers with 7 years of teaching experience are exempted from the Entrance Test. The maximum number of candidates permitted to work under a research guide in the college is four. Teachers are allowed to do part-time research. Candidates shall send their applications to the Registrar, University of Calicut through the college.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- Students shall not bring outsiders to the college.
- Using mobile phone is strictly prohibited in the campus.
- Campus should be kept clean and beautiful.
- Students shall leave the campus as soon as the classes are over for the day.
- Students shall obey the rules framed by the Principal for the smooth functioning of the institution.
- Neckband identity card is compulsory for all students and should wear it in the campus.
- Any tampering or disfiguring made on the identity card will be viewed seriously.
- Smoking, alcohol, tobacco consumption and drug trafficking are prohibited in the campus.
- 75 % attendance is compulsory to appear for University examination.
- Students are requested to remit all fees before the last date given, failing which they will be removed from the college rolls on the next working day itself without further notice. Such students are not eligible for attendance. (Govt. order No. Audit B1/106085/2001/coll. Edn., dated 29-10-01).

Prohibition of Political Activity

- Students shall not get involved in any political activity by him or abet the said activity to be carried on by fellow students inside the campus in any manner whatsoever and any such activity is hereby banned inside the campus.
- Taking part in any political activity by organizing or cause gatherings inside the college campus for the purpose of doing any such activities as defined by rule 4 (6) shall constitute serious indiscipline. Every member of such a gathering shall be individually liable and responsible for the gross indiscipline in this regard and the Principal shall have the power to take disciplinary action against students who indulge in the aforesaid activities.
- It shall constitute gross indiscipline to call for an appeal to strike based on policies and ideologies that may be preached by the political parties or their student organizations or student wings. The participants in the strike as aforesaid shall be dealt with by the disciplinary authority and they shall be imposed appropriate punishment as provided in these rules.
- No student of the college shall stage or indulge in any activity like Dharna, Gharao, and obstructing entry to and from any class room, office or other places inside the campus and such activities shall be treated as misconduct.
- No student shall shout slogans inside the class rooms, office or any other place inside the campus and obstruct or cause disturbance and nuisance to the normal functioning of the institution. These activities shall be treated as misconduct.

Parking of Vehicles

Students are allowed to park their vehicles in the campus only with the prior written permission of the Principal. Application in the prescribed format should be submitted in this regard.

Punishment for Misconduct

Disciplinary action will be taken against students who commit misconduct as referred to in rules above, after conducting proper enquiry by a commission duly appointed by the college council, if necessary. The punishment may be

1. Fine
2. Issuance of the compulsory TC
3. Dismissal from the college

In the event of imposition of punishment of Dismissal or compulsory Issuance of TC, the case will be reported to the University.

Prohibition of Damage to Property

Students shall not disfigure the class room, compound wall, or other buildings, inside the college campus by pasting posters or writing on the walls in connection with any activity. They shall not damage or destroy any furniture, equipment and other materials inside the campus. In the event of any student indulging in any such activities, a fine shall be imposed on him/her to be fixed by the Principal of the college after evaluating the extent and magnitude of the damage so caused. The aforesaid imposition of fine without prejudice to the liability of the delinquent student for prosecution under the provisions of the Indian Penal Code or under the provisions of prevention of damage of public properties act. The damage so fixed by the Principal shall be recovered as arrears of land revenue and in the event of non-payment, the recovery proceedings shall be taken against the person responsible.

Prohibition of Ragging

Ragging is prohibited in the College campus as per the Kerala Ragging Prohibition Act 1998 and UGC Regulations 2009. According to Section 2(B) of the act, ragging can be any physical or mental torture or any disorderly conduct towards any student of an educational institution, causing apprehension, dread, humiliation or agitation in him/her. It can be any harassment like insulting, teasing, bullying or manhandling. It can also be forcing upon him/her to do

something which he/she voluntarily won't dare to do normally. Anti ragging committee, Anti ragging squad are constituted to curb the menace of ragging in the College campus.

Punishment for Ragging

Any student involved in ragging/persuades others for ragging or advocates ragging /either inside or outside an educational institution shall be subject to a punishment of not more than 2 years imprisonment in addition to a penalty of Rs. 10,000/-. A student who is punished for ragging is liable to be dismissed from the institution and is barred from being admitted to any other institution for a period of 3 years from the date of receipt of his/her dismissal order.

If a student/parent/guardian or any teacher of the institution forwards a written complaint to the Principal, he has to make an urgent enquiry into the matter within 7 days of the receipt of such a complaint. If the allegation is proved to be correct, the accused must be suspended with immediate effect and the matter must be referred to the police for further proceedings. If a written

complaint is received by the Principal, he has to make a detailed enquiry and if it is found baseless, the complainant must be informed of it in writing.

Sexual Harassment

Kerala has high female literacy rate, high enrollment and low dropouts from schools, low infant mortality rate, high sex ratio, higher age at marriage, long life expectancy and low fertility for women. At the same time, violence against women has also been increasing. We have been witnessing violence of different types within the family, in public places, in work situations, while using public transportation and so on. It would appear as though women are no safer anywhere and they have to be always alert against harassment. The Supreme Court judgment provides a definition of sexual harassment. According to this; sexual harassment includes any unwelcome sexually determined behavior whether directly or by implication as

1. Physical contacts and advances
2. A demand or request for sexual favors
3. Sexually colored remarks
4. Showing pornography
5. Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature.

Sexual Harassment –Legal Implications

A student guilty of sexual harassment, shall be liable for any of the following penalties:

1. Warning, reprimand or censure
2. Suspension from the college for a period of one month
3. Debarment from appearing for the final examination for a period up to 3 years
4. Rustication from the college

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)

The sexual harassment of women at workplace Act, 2013 mandated the establishment of an Internal Complaints Committee to look into the issues of sexual harassment and gender-based violence in all the institutions. Accordingly, the ICC is entrusted with the responsibility of inquiring into the complaints made by aggrieved women in a time bound manner and recommend penal consequences to the offender as per legal provisions. The special women cell acts as a watch dog of ICC and ensures timely report of such incidences. It also organizes gender sensitization programmes in the campus.

Admission and Withdrawal

1. Students are usually admitted only in the beginning of the 1st term of the year to the degree and post graduate courses.
2. Application for admission must be made in the prescribed form which can be had from the college on payment of a registration fee of Rs. 55/-
3. Applicant for admission to the 1st year degree class must have passed the +2 of Govt. of Kerala or 12th class of CBSE or an examination recognized equivalent there to. Those for admission to Post Graduate course must have passed degree examinations in the concerned subject with the required minimum percentage of marks.
4. Candidates seeking admission must produce transfer and conduct certificates from the school or college they last attended and qualifying certificates and mark list in original at the time of admission.
5. Candidates seeking admission to the college from other universities should apply for recognition from the University of Calicut.
6. Candidates considered for admission will be required to appear for an interview before the principal after receiving the intimation card. The selection is provisional and is subject to confirmation after the interview and scrutiny of the certificates.
7. Candidates selected for admission will have to pay the required tuition fees due at the time of admission, caution deposit and all other fees prescribed by the college. Fees once paid will not be returned.
8. Any candidate found to have obtained admission by false representation shall be summarily dismissed and shall forfeit whatever fees he/she may have paid.
9. Students belonging to scheduled caste and scheduled tribe and converts from these castes and tribes as evidenced by their S.S.L.C. Certificate need not pay any tuition fees. Students belonging to other backward classes and converts from other region should produce the community and income certificate from

the regional Tahsildar at the time of admission, failing which they will not be exempted from the payment of fees.

10. A student applying for Transfer Certificate will not be given the certificate unless he/ she pays all fees and other dues as the principal may deem fit. Usually transfer certificates are not issued to the students before the completion of their courses of study.
11. A late fee of Rs. 25 will be charged if a student applies for T.C one year after the beginning of the academic year immediately following that during which he/she has been last enrolled. A fee of Rs 50/- will be charged for the issue of a duplicate transfer certificate.
12. Students who have left the college with T.C are not eligible to get a new one for a second time. However duplicate certificate will be issued on production of an affidavit signed by a Judicial First Class Magistrate.
13. A student applying for the release of any document from the college must have cleared all dues to the college.
14. A fees of Rs.100/- will be charged for a document that needs reference to the record older than five years.

Academic Tenure and Attendance

1. The academic year 2024– 2025 will begin and end as follows:

Odd Semester: June, July, August, September, October & November

Even Semester: December, January, February & March

The teaching day is divided into two sessions, the forenoon session of three hours and the afternoon session of two hours. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each hour by the teacher engaging the class. Late comers will not be entertained. For the purpose of attendance, all teaching days irrespective of working periods shall be considered as full working days. Absenting an hour in any session will be treated as half days absence. Leave for one hour can be obtained from the teacher in charge of the class.

2. Application for long leave should be made to the Principal through the class tutor and HOD. Application for sick leave for more than three days should be supported by reliable medical certificate.
3. Absence for more than 10 consecutive days without proper reason will result in the removal of name from the rolls.
4. Promotion to the senior classes and appearance for University Examinations shall be subjected to the following conditions.
 - a. The student should have earned at least 75% of the attendance prescribed by the college for the course during the year.
 - b. She/he should have completed the course of instruction to the satisfaction of the college authorities and his/her progress, conduct and character should be satisfactory.
 - c. NCC cadets will not be sent for the University examinations or the annual examination of the college if he/she has not earned 75% attendance at the NCC parades.
 - d. A student who has not registered for the University examinations for the junior class will not be eligible for promotion to the next class.
5. No concession of attendance will be allowed to College Union Office Bearers for organizing College Union Activities. But attendance to those office bearers will be allowed as per University Guidelines.
6. Student seeking exemption from rules relating to minimum attendance should apply for exemption to the University through the Principal before 28th February. Every application for exemption shall be made in the prescribed form accompanied by a challan for required fee. The reason for each day's absence has to be explained. In case of absence on account of illness, medical certificate should also be furnished. No application for exemption will be recommended by the Principal unless he is satisfied that the shortage of attendance was beyond the student's control. In no case will exemption be granted by the University if the shortage of attendance exceeds 20 days. Exemption will not be granted to the same student for more than one

academic year in a course. Absence without leave will not be considered under any circumstances.

College Level Examinations

Library and Reading Room

The primary purpose of the library is to develop a learning environment for the academic community. It serves as a hub for gathering information resources on every subject the college offers. It is an integral part of the college and plays a pivotal role in dissemination of knowledge through books, journals, magazines and other digital media. A cloud-hosted OPAC is now accessible, and a D space repository has been established for digital archives and to facilitate access to institutional output. The library has recently initiated a subscription to Magzter platform and acquired membership with the British Council Digital Library. A web centric, open-source library management software, KOHA, is used for automating library housekeeping operations.

Library Rules.

1. Registration should be done to become a member and to use library resources.
2. Strict silence and discipline must be observed inside the library.
3. College identity card is compulsory for all users. This card is strictly non- transferable.
4. The users must record their visit to library.
5. Users are supposed to deposit their personal belongings at the property counter prior to their entry into the library.
6. Library follows open access system and users should try to replace books in their original position in the shelf after consulting. If in doubt, they may keep the book on their reading table.
7. Newspapers, Magazines and Journals must be read only in the library on specific tables and should not be taken outside.
8. Users should not disturb the arrangements of books.
9. Users should take care of cleanliness of the library.

10. The Library will be open from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days.
11. Books from the library will be issued on days and hours notified by the Librarian.
12. Students must examine books issued to them and report damages, if any, to the Librarian before taking them away.
13. Books issued must be returned within fourteen days from the date of issue.
14. Users who fail to return the books within the due date shall pay a fine of Rs. 1/- per book per day.
15. Users are not allowed to borrow books on behalf of others or transfer borrowed materials from/to other students.
16. Reference documents like Dictionary, Encyclopedia, Year Books, Journals and Project Reports are only for consultation within the Library.
17. Readers should not mark, underline, write, tear pages or otherwise damage the resources of the library in any way. If anyone is found doing so, he/she will be charged the full replacement cost of the resource.
18. Library materials may not be taken outside without proper authentication by library staff.
